DUES INCREASE

As previously mentioned in the April 2008 Newsletter, HHCA dues will be increased to \$300.00 per year beginning January 2009. The \$100.00 increase per unit will go DIRECTLY to the Road Repair Fund as a supplement to the \$20,000 dollars per year we already set aside.

ASSOCIATION DUES

The following units are behind in their association dues by a minimum of one year:

As you can see, there are **35** units that are one year or more behind in their association dues. Unfortunately, this affects every homeowner in the subdivision. The Board is working very hard to collect these past dues. If you need to make arrangements to become current with your dues, please

SOLICITORS

HHCA has received inquiries regarding stopping the amount of solicitors that frequent the subdivision. The Board has decided that a homeowner who would like to stop solicitation should put a sign on their individual unit.

TRASH REMOVAL:

HHCA recommends the following two trash removal companies. It would be appreciated if each homeowner would use one of the following companies for their trash removal. Fewer trucks on our roads would help alleviate wear and tear.

*HMS:

\$33.00 per quarter w/o 96 gallon cart (weekly trash pick up; free large item per month)

\$39.00 per quarter w/96 gallon cart.

\$ 2.00 per yard waste bag

**Also, HMS takes recycled materials (picked up bi-monthly) to a recycling facility and yard waste to a compost farm.*

SUPERIOR SANITATION: (810) 227-1298

\$33.00 per quarter w/o 95 gallon cart; up to 4 cans of your own or 12 kitchen bags (weekly trash pick up)

\$39.00 per quarter w/ 95 gallon cart; plus 1 can or 4 kitchen bags.

Includes 2 bags of yard waste per week at no charge (\$1.00 per additional bag must be called in advance)

-- REMEMBER --

Unlicensed motor vehicles are prohibited!

SNOW REMOVAL:

HHCA has been in touch with our snow removal contractor from last season and has renewed our contract with them for this season. They have requested that, as a community, we assist them so that they can do the same great job as last year. If we all do the following steps, we can ensure our streets are safe during the winter months:

- ✓ Overnight parking is **prohibited** and can cause a hazard to your neighbor when snow is plowed around your parked vehicle pushing the snow into their path. Plow operators can remove the snow more safely and efficiently with reduced vehicles parked on our streets.
- ✓ Mark your curbs and roadside sprinkler heads. Drivers can minimize lawn damage provided the edges are clearly staked.
- ✓ Do not plow/blow/shovel snow from the driveway into the streets and/or storm drains. Streets can quickly become dangerous with additional snow piled in them. Please keep storm drains open to provide for proper drainage and help prevent undue icing on roads.
